

LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

I talked to the surveying firm that is surveying our property frontage to determine exactly where our property line is located. Since the survey provided to us from Van Cleef Engineering Associates was last done in 1989, we are waiting for NJDOT to furnish us with the construction maps. Since they are extremely back logged with projects throughout the state the normal two week wait has become six plus weeks. The surveyor should have this information by the middle of January and should be able to determine what responsibilities we may have concerning our sign, fencing and the two stone lighted pillars on each side of the driveway as to moving them if they are not within our "right-of-way". Our hope is that we are within our "right-of-way" and the expense to move anything, if necessary, will be on NJDOT.





Section 3.080.
