

LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

We electronically received the latest survey from Van Cleef Engineering Associates. What they had in their files was dated from 1988. Copies were sent to our lawyer Mark Anderson Esq. and to John Akabogu who is representing the NJDOT. There is a discrepancy between what we presume is our "right of way". To contest their opinion, we will need to hire a licensed surveyor to define exactly where our "right of way" exists. We have contacted the firms of Brunswick West, Van Cleef Engineering Associates, Bohren & Bohren and Jim Mantz of Jim Mantz Engineering to get costs. We are looking to only have the frontage done to see if the sign, fence and the stone pillars n each side of the driveway are within our "right of way".

Once we have established the cost to survey the frontage from each of the engineering firms, we will present the proposals to the membership on the lodge floor for approval.

If these items need to be relocated or removed, we will need to get pricing from multiple companies. Hopefully, members can assist in these projects and we will also see if we can get financial relief from the state as any and all will be expensive.

We will keep the membership informed, in the Elks Tale, as this process moves forward.

Finally, I hope Santa brings me a dog this year. I am going to name it Naked, so I can tell people that I have to go walk Naked down the street.



Section 3.080. Nominations for offices to be filled at the annual election in Lodges shall be made in the order in which they appear in Section 2 of Article VII of the Constitution of the Order at any regular meeting of the Lodge on or after the 1st day of January if meetings are held monthly, or after the 1st day of February and prior to the date of the annual election, provided, however, that if no nomination for an office shall have been made prior to the date of the election, or if all candidates previously nominated for an office, shall have declined or withdrawn, nominations for that office may be made on the date of election.



On Saturday September 14, 2024, the Flemington Elks Lodge will celebrate 70 years serving the Flemington-Raritan Community.
