Lodge and Auxiliary Email Blasts;

I've been sending email blasts on a regular basis to lodge and auxiliary members for about 15 years. The information has included Friday Night Dinner menus; Pasta Night menus; Sunday breakfast notices; Grill Room events; lodge and auxiliary committee benefits and fundraising events; and messages from the Exalted Ruler. Over the past few weeks and months I haven't received much information to share with the membership. Recently, I've received quite a few negative emails stating that I intentionally don't share event information, and that "people" don't receive any communication. I don't know who "people" refers to, but some possible reasons why I've received these comments might be the following:

- 1. Members haven't communicated the details of the events that they're sponsoring. Recently I received four emails from four different people regarding an event. None of those emails contained detailed information (time, date, committee hosting the event, food or no food, cost of event). If you're planning an event, please don't wait until two days before the event, or the day of the event, to let me know the details.
- 2. Members haven't provided a working email address to me or Lodge Secretary Barry Sheppard. Barry and I have worked together on this project for years.
- 3. Member has blocked my email address, ensuring that they don't receive any communication.
- 4. Member has changed his/her email address and never informed me or Barry of the change. I have also heard complaints that I delete names at will. This has never happened.


